
Dear Friends,

ROTARY ALUMNI CELEBRATION DISTINGUISHED SPEAKERS



Donald Bobiash grew up on a farm near Zelma, Saskatchewan, Canada. He has a doctorate in international relations from Oxford University, where he was a Rhodes Scholar, and a master's in industrial relations and personnel management from the London School of Economics, where he was a Commonwealth Scholar. He earned a bachelor's in political science at the University of Saskatchewan and has studied at Laval University in Québec City and l'École nationale d'administration in Dakar, Senegal, where he was an Ambassadorial Scholar. Macmillan of London has published his book *South-South Aid: How Developing Countries Help Each Other*. He was the recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Scholar Alumni Achievement Award (now the Global Alumni Service to Humanity Award) in 1995-96.

Bobiash is director-general for Africa at Foreign Affairs and International Trade Canada. He recently served as deputy head of mission in the Canadian Embassy in Tokyo. From August 2004 until August 2006, he was Canadian high commissioner to Ghana and ambassador to Togo. He joined the foreign affairs department in 1989 and has served in Canadian missions in Islamabad, Pakistan, and Tokyo. At headquarters, he has worked in the divisions responsible for policy planning, South Asian relations, economic relations with developing countries, South American relations, and La Francophonie. He has also served as director of the Southeast Asia Division.

Bobiash is married to Teresa Rozkiewicz. They have two daughters, Ariane and Catherine.



Peter Kyle is an international attorney based in Washington, D.C., and has been named by The Rotary Foundation Trustees as the recipient of the Foundation's 2009-10 Global Alumni Service to Humanity Award. A member of the Rotary Club of Capitol Hill (Washington, D.C.), Kyle has worked on more than 100 development projects in over 80 countries for the World Bank, advising on legal infrastructure to foster a stronger economy. He retired as lead counsel of the World Bank in 2009 after a 17-year career and continues to serve as a consultant. Before working for the World Bank, Kyle was counsel for the Asian Development Bank, based in Manila, Philippines, and in private practice in New Zealand. Sponsored by the Rotary Club of Wellington North, New Zealand, Kyle studied law at the University of Virginia in the United States as a 1973-74 Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholar.

Kyle has served as a member of the Rotary Foundation Alumni Advisory Committee for three years and as RI representative to the World Bank, and also serves as district alumni subcommittee chair and district Rotary Peace Fellowships chair. In New Zealand, he served as district Rotary Youth Leadership Awards chair. He has also been active with Outward Bound.
